FROM THE PASTOR



ON THE DORMITION

In the row of icons of the Great Feasts below the Iconostas, we see, not only the great twelve Feasts of our Lord Jesus, but also the ones dedicated to the Virgin Mary. The one that is most popular is the icon of the Feast of the Dormition, the Falling-Asleep of the Most Holy Mother of God.

The Dormition Feast is associated most notably with Jerusalem, which contains Mary's Tomb and the Basilica of the Dormition; Ephesus, which contains the House of the Virgin Mary; Constantinople, where the Belt (Zoni) of the Virgin Mary was enshrined from the 5th through 14th centuries.

The first four Christian centuries are silent regarding the end of the Virgin Mary's life, though it is asserted, without surviving documentation, that the feast of the Dormition was being observed in Jerusalem shortly after the Council of Ephesus.

In the later 5th century, when the earliest Dormition traditions surface in manuscripts, the sudden appearance of three distinct narrative traditions describing the end of Mary's life. These are found in what are known as the New Testament Apocrypha.

There are traditional depictions of the Dormition of the Theotokos in Byzantine iconography. Christ is seen coming to receive the soul of His mother surrounded by a cloud of blinding light and accompanied by the angels and prophets. In Byzantine iconography the only other depictions like this of Christ, surrounded by such a cloud of light, are seen in icons of the Transfiguration, the Resurrection and the Last Judgment (all major Feasts of the Lord). This is a direct reference to the importance of this Feast of the Virgin Mary.

The Dormition Feast explains to us the origin of the hymn that we sing to the Mother of

God: 'More honorable than the Cherubim, beyond compare more glorious than the Seraphim'. These are not simply elegant words that a pious hymnographer sat down and wrote, they have an origin in a spiritual revelation, of all that is in the Church.

This Feast reminds us of how our Lord entrusted the care of His Mother to the Apostle John while He was hanging on the Cross. It reminds us of how the Holy Virgin, then aged about sixty, was visited three days before her falling-asleep by the Archangel Gabriel, who long before had announced to her the conception of Christ in her womb. We recall how the Apostles were miraculously brought to Jerusalem to make their farewells. We learn how the Virgin gave away all her earthly possessions to poor widows as she made ready for her burial in Gethsemane, next to her parents SS Joachim and Anna and also Joseph, her protector.

We remember how she comforted the grieving, how her house was filled with light, her face shone and her body was fragrant, as Christ came with the angels to take her soul, all depicted in the icon of this Feast. We are reminded how her soul was taken up by Her Son, together with the cherubim and the seraphim, and now we understand, the origin of our hymn: 'More honorable than the cherubim, more glorious beyond compare than the seraphim'. We are reminded of the Apostles, singing in procession, took her body to the tomb which they sealed.

We see how the Apostle Thomas arrived late, delayed for three days, and wanted so much to make his farewell. The tomb was unsealed and found empty except for the burial clothes and that wonderful fragrance. And from the very beginning we Orthodox have piously taken this to mean that the body of the Holy Virgin was so pure that it too had been taken up to Heaven, and that is why we do not have any bodily relic of the Mother of God.

We learn from this that the first in the Kingdom of Heaven after Christ is the Holy Virgin. By her example, even in the weakness of human nature, it is possible for our bodies to attain to holiness. The Mother of God is, after Christ, the first-fruit of the Resurrection and she shows us the way to the life in the Resurrection.

Of course there are people who will tell you that none of this is written in the Bible. But for us Orthodox the Holy Scriptures are only part of the ongoing Revelation of the Holy Spirit, which we call the Holy Tradition. We are not dead to the Spirit, the Spirit speaks to us still, with even more revelations about the life of the Coming Kingdom.

There is a tradition in the Orthodox Church that cemetery churches or chapels are mainly dedicated either to the Resurrection or to the Dormition. This is a direct reference to the fact that, as faithful Christians, we truly believe that there is something more than just our earthly existence. We might die physically here on earth but we continue to live in Christ along with the Holy Virgin, in heaven until the blessed Second Coming of our Lord.

Remember that this Feastday is so important to our faith that it is preceded by 15 days of spiritual preparation and fasting. We also remember the names of our family members, and pray for their continued health, with the chanting of the Paraklisis/Supplication services.

This is the Holy Dormition.

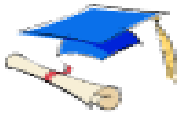

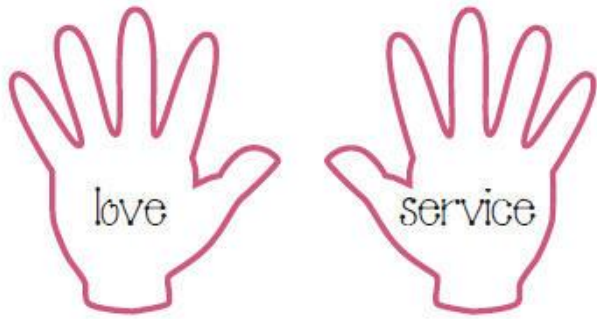
FATHER NICK AWAY

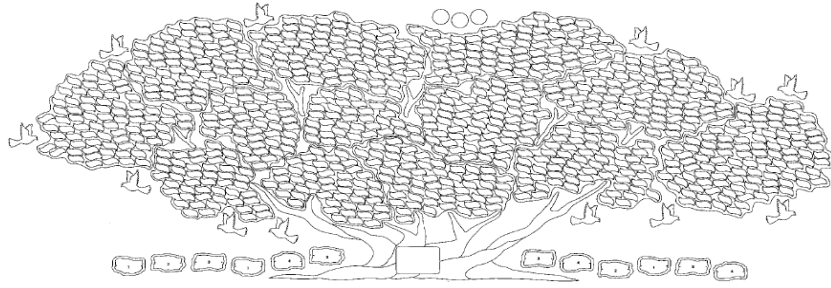

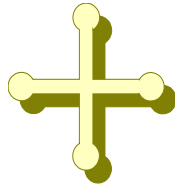

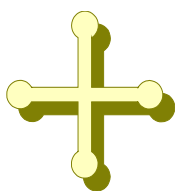
